Labels: create labels for display. Change font size, style, size and colour.

Fact sheet: create a simple fact sheet showing Egyptian life, clothing, food, religion

Poem: write a poem about the River Nile.

Story: write a short story or diary entry about part of a day in the life of an Egyptian.

Writing Hieroglyphics: use the Egyptian Name Translator on the Eyelid website to write names hieroglyphics.

Research: use the Internet and/or CD ROMS to:

- find Egypt and the River Nile on a world map.
- look at websites to discover the Egyptian way of life and culture.
- examine artifacts.
- use websites, CD ROMs or Encarta to find specific information about selected main features of Egyptian life.
